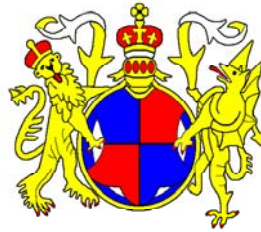

Referees

Contact the referee for confirmation of match time and pitch location.

Tournaments

Information must be submitted to the VRU Vice-President 3 months prior to the tournament.

MARFU Coaching Policy

Applicable for the EPRU, PRU and VRU, effective **January 1, 2004**:

All clubs (men's & women's clubs, men's & women colleges, boys' & girls' high school teams) will be required to have as a coach an individual that is certified at USA Rugby's Level I (minimum standard); the only exception is Youth (defined as an Under-15 team). After January 2004, a club that doesn't have an individual coaching them certified at Level I would be denied a referee. In lieu of this 2004 requirement (for a new coach-only), the club must have their coach registered at the next MARFU sponsored coaching clinic; if the coach fails to attend the clinic, referees will not be assigned and any referees already assigned will be re-allocated.

As I step down after ten years of presidency, I would like to extend a sincere word of thanks to all those who have served on the Virginia Rugby Executive Committee and to those who have help with our All-Star program. Your commitments have been very much appreciated.

Vice-President

The Vice President's three primary functions are managing tournament applications, monitoring CIPP compliance and administering the Don Bridge's Fund. Currently, our Treasurer administers the Don Bridge's Fund.

Tournament Applications

The VRU Handbook requires Event Applications be submitted on the official form provided in the handbook at least **90 days in advance** of the event in order to be considered. We have this requirement to make sure there are no conflicts with other tournaments, that there are enough referees to cover the matches, and to allow teams time to correct any problems with their application. Teams must be current with all financial obligations to the VRU, be Club CIPP registered and have a viable number of players CIPP registered. This year teams submitted Event Applications an average of **55 days prior** to their proposed event. **Based on this number, there is still room for improvement.** I urge teams to submit their Event Application according to the guidelines outlined in the VRU Handbook so that the VRU can better accommodate requests.

The VRU Tournament Application now requests that the tournament point of contact (POC) provide a viable email address. Providing an email address allows for greater ease of communication between the VP and the requesting club. Please be sure to include email addresses on future applications.

CIPP Compliance

The VRU currently requires the match referee to collect CIPP rosters from each team and send them to the VRU Vice President. Teams are required to submit rosters with both players' names and CIPP numbers to the referee prior to the match. **It is the responsibility of the teams playing the match to find the referee and submit the roster. The referee is not required to find you.** The VRU Handbook has a recommended form to use when submitting this information. Team rosters printed directly from the USA Rugby website can be used if the positions played by each player are annotated. USA Rugby now provides online registration with "real-time" CIPP application processing. **Teams are reminded that they can no longer write "pending" next to any name on the roster to denote applications that are pending approval from USA Rugby.** If a certified RSV referee is not available for your match, please have the acting referee for your match submit the rosters. This is the responsibility of the hosting team. **This is especially important this year because USA Rugby has changed the yearly CIPP term to reflect current seasons (Aug to Aug).** Please make sure all teams members are properly CIPPed.

This year **44% of rosters** required were turned in to the VRU VP. **This is up 7% from the previous year.** This is a step in the right direction and look forward to further improvement. Club liability insurance programs require that Clubs and all the players in a match be CIPP registered in order for the liability insurance to be in effect. Fifteens clubs must have at least 15 players registered in addition to the club being registered to qualify for the insurance. The VRU VP will monitor the USA Rugby CIPP database and will be notifying teams that have too few players registered. Teams that are not in compliance will be liable for sanctions. Please turn in your rosters.

VRU Handbook

Typically, the VRU Secretary doesn't provide the report on the Handbook, but... since I do both I'll make a brief comment: We've been doing the Handbook since 1991; prior to that, guidelines were passed down by scraps of paper or word of mouth. In 1997, the handbook was published in two formats: hard copy and on-line (at <http://www.rugby.org>). We continue to provide a handbook for off-line usage and believe it is still valuable. In fact, printing costs have dropped over the years and, for 2009, we will be publishing the Handbook in a paperback format that should save additional funds (although deadlines for edits or new submissions will be earlier). Also, for 2009, we will have re-writes to the guidelines and the by-laws to make them a bit more gender-neutral.

Treasurer's Notes

- The VRU Executive Committee is not recommending another increase in annual dues for FY2008.
- Clubs will be billed \$425.00 in the Spring and \$425.00 in the Fall for FY2008.
- Colleges will be billed for \$850.00 in the Fall of FY2008 for the 2008-2009 Academic Year.
- Previous budget reports did not include old dues recovery and were never reported separately.
- At the beginning of FY2007 there was \$ 16,792.50 in outstanding dues owed to the VRU.
- At the beginning of FY2008 there was \$7,473.75 in outstanding dues owed to the VRU
- Dues collections have improved to constitute, comparatively, a 56% decrease in accounts receivable or outstanding dues.
- The Don Bridges Fund has grown 55% since 2004.
- The Long Term Savings has grown 32% since 2004.
- A VRU reimbursement form will be created and incorporated in FY2008 for use by the VRU Executive Committee and all members of the VRU who wish to submit a legitimate reimbursable expense to the VRU Executive Committee. This will ensure a more efficient and timely reimbursement process. Stay tuned for implementation of this form.
- To ensure full disclosure, quarterly VRU reports will be made available by the Treasurer to the VRU Executive Committee and for all VRU members interested.

New CIPP Registration Information

As a result of the registration season change, all USA Rugby member and club dues will be pro-rated beginning January 1, 2008.

Individual and Club Registration now runs on a competitive year rather than a calendar year. If you registered for the 2007 registration period anytime before August 1, 2007, your registration will expire on December 31, 2007. If you registered anytime after August 1, 2007, your registration will expire on August 31, 2008.

These new dues will update automatically, all you need to do is register!

USA Rugby's New Individual CIPP Transfer Procedure

Beginning January 1, 2008, USA Rugby will adopt a new procedure for transferring an individual's registration. In order to allow appropriate levels of administration access to an individual's movement between current and prospective clubs (which can also include new local and territorial administration), all parties involved now have a voice regarding the transfer. Previously, transfers processed at the national level were based solely on the individual's request without club or local area input. Due to eligibility violations as well as administrative ease, club and LAU officials are able to approve and deny every transfer to and from their organizations.

To submit a transfer request prior to this change, please go to www.usarugby.org/goto/Transfer_Inquiry to print and complete the Transfer Form. USA Rugby must receive these completed forms by December 25, 2007.

Beginning January 1, 2008, all transfers will be processed through secured logins of the individual, club administrators, and Local Area Union Transfer Managers.

USA Rugby Signs National Guard as a Sponsor

USA Rugby and the Army National Guard announced today that they have signed an agreement that will make the Army National Guard an Official Sponsor of USA Rugby.

This deal includes title sponsorship of USA rugby's College and High School Championships as well as select National Teams.

This strategic partnership will enhance the support provided to the nation's top performing rugby athletes in premier matches throughout the United States. The National Guard's sponsorship of USA Rugby will include events such as the U.S. National College Playoffs and Championships, the Boys and Girls High School Championships, the National Guard Military Challenge and select Men*s and Women*s Championship events.

In addition to title sponsorships, another added benefit of this new partnership is that in conjunction with official USA Rugby licensees, USA Rugby and the National Guard will also launch a comprehensive college kit campaign that will provide apparel and equipment to 300 college teams across the U.S. All colleges in good standing with USA Rugby will be eligible to apply for the free college kit.

USA Rugby Board/Congress

Americas International Tournament is a priority for the IRB to develop International Competitions. Thus, an aggressive vote to seize change and grasp the opportunities facing USA Rugby in 2005 was supported less than a year later with the adoption of a new strategic plan that included a radically different governance model moving from a constituent-based Board to a strategic one, that consists of six Independent Directors, two International Athlete representatives and a representative of USA Rugby's Congress.

The Board is charged with developing and implementing the annual operational plans and establishing appropriate networks of volunteers and expert advisory groups to assist them in implementing the strategic and operational plans includes independent directors.

High Performance

In April of 2007, CEO Nigel Melville reported on High Performance program, visit to IRB and U19 World Cup in Belfast. Key points: IRB impressed with progress that is being made at USA Rugby. As a result they are looking to increase the number of IRB core events in 2008 from 3 to possibly 5, and consider core membership in 2009.

The Eagles U19 team came third in the 2nd Tier World Cup in Belfast and have qualified for the 2009 Tier 1 U20 World Championships in Wales.

CEO meeting Dan Collins (IRB HP Unit) in Boulder to discuss the setting up of Academies in the USA, commencing July 2008.

NA4 preparations are on track, Churchill Cup squad will be selected from the NA4 competition.

CEO is meeting with all national Coaches to align their programs for 2008/09/10. This includes, fixtures, tours and training camps. The plans will be presented to the IRB for increased funding.

It was agreed that the All American Collegiate Program should be developed and opportunities to tour eg. Japan Universities should be explored.

The Importance of the Men's National All-Star Championship

USA Rugby is releasing its first steps towards qualifying for the 2011 Rugby World Cup – the announcement of its plans for an Elite Player Squad for 2008.

While the complete 2008 High Performance plan for both men and women has yet to be released, USA Rugby CEO and President of Rugby Operations, Nigel Melville has confirmed the importance of this year's Men's All-Star Championships.

“Whilst many of the Rugby World Cup stars may be taking a well-deserved rest in December, this provides an opportunity for over 200 players to show us what they can do. USA Rugby is now focused on the future,” Melville said.

“The National All-Star Championships will give me the opportunity to select an extended squad of potential Eagles who will be invited to join the 2008 Elite Player program. When the new Eagles coach takes their position in the new year, they will have a squad that they can commence work with immediately.

“Many people have suggested that the 2008 All-Star Championships are not as important this year, but really it should be the opposite,” Melville added, “This event will open the door to several players with ambitions to make the National Team and be apart of our plans for the 2008 season.”

- Priority 2010 and 2009 (7’s) Rugby World Cups.
- Elite Player programs to mirror the men’s program.
- Sponsorship needed to assist the program – marketing plan for women’s game needs to be developed and competition sold.
- England Tour to England – no budget – First Sports has agreed to sponsor the tour, we found extra budget, and women raised monies thru fundraising activities.
- New year an Elite Player squad (Men and Women) will be announced for 2008.

Youth Conference Information

- This year Conference was about the real issues, the coaching and development of programs, the non-contact game, the challenges everyone faced and the plans for new initiatives in the youth sector for 2008.
- At Conference Mark Griffin’s Play Rugby program was presented with the Hershey’s Strive Award for excellence.
- The National Council for Youth Sports represents over 50 million youth athletes; the award is recognition of some of the positive impact USA Rugby youth programs are having on the sporting community. Mark is to be congratulated for his efforts.

Background Checks

It was agreed, that our background check policy must provide our players with coaches of the highest standards and background checks should be compulsory for Youth and High School coaches. CEO to make a final proposal on the impact and cost of broadening these checks. The following is the updated policy as of March 2007:

‘In an effort to protect the youth and to raise the standards of USA Rugby, every youth, high school & college level coach, administrator and any other individual designated by the head coach, who will be alone with players or responsible for a team during a game, practice, or travel to and from any rugby event is required to pass a criminal background screening.’

2007 saw some turnover in the VRU Men's Collegiate Division. ODU won the CM Div III portion of the Ed Lee, and W&L came in as runner up. Both clubs will compete against the EPRU Div III Champion and runner up in March at the MARFU Collegiate Championships. Well done. Our thanks also to the James River RFC for hosting the 2008 MARFU Collegiate Men and Women's Division I and II Semi finals and finals here in Hanover County. This keeps the costs down for the VRU teams, and gives them "home field advantage".

As a result of a strong finish in the fall, ODU is moving to Division II next fall, as is W&M. University of Mary Washington will move down to Division III to rebuild. Radford is considering the move to join VT and UVA in the fledgling MARFU CM Premier Division (D1). So, next fall, the VRU CM D II will possibly have either 6 or 7 clubs.

Therefore, the practice of promotion/relegation has been re established in this years handbook, where you can read all the details.

Radford returned as VRU DII Champion this past fall, and UR secured the runner-up slot for the first time in recent history. As the VRU still controls 3 seeds to the MARFU playoffs, these two clubs will be joined by VMI in the MARFU playoffs beginning March 22.

Virginia secured the Championship for Division I, defeating Va. Tech, at the Ed Lee.

Sadly, the Ed Lee Cup has been discontinued for the time being. Due to forces beyond union control, the event had lost much of it's luster in recent years, and has been retired. How divisional champions will be determined for 2008-09 has yet to be determined.

Communication:

Club officers need to make sure that your officers addresses are kept up to date on the VRU website. Email has made communicating much easier, but we can't keep you informed if we don't know how to find you.

Union Dues and Referees Fees:

College Men's Clubs are reminded to arrange for payment of their VRU dues and the Referees fees immediately. The Referees Society of Virginia has instituted a 10% fine for payments not received within 30 days of invoice. Real problem arise when these clubs do not stay in touch with your coordinator and the treasurer's so that we know you are working getting these two separate fees paid. For the college clubs only, your VRU dues come each September for the next academic year. Your referee's fees are invoiced shortly after each season, and are due by the beginning of the following season. Check your club mailboxes regularly.

Coaching:

Many of the College Men's clubs have full time coaches, most of which have completed at least Level I of the USA Coaches Certification program. Please be reminded that this has been a MARFU requirement as of January 1, 2004. Also, each collegiate coach must CIPP register on a special form which can be located at the USA website. The VRU has applied to host a Coaching Certification Clinic again this August, in Richmond. As many of you know, the VRU will pay the full ticket for one coach from each club each year, so if you have coach, there is no reason why he/she should not be certified. If you do not have a coach, send a Captain or leader from your club.

Discipline:

Red and Yellow card issued during the past year or more can viewed at the MARFU website. Clubs and players are warned that Big Brother is watching, and foul, dangerous or abusive conduct will not be tolerated.

Match Cancellations and Scheduling:

Schedules should be completed early and submitted for posting on the VRU website. Then, your match secretary needs to go to the website and verify that your clubs schedule is posted correctly, and immediately notify me of any

problems. Then, at least a full week (Sunday night, usually) before a match, get on the phone or the internet and verify that all is set with your opponent, whether you are home or away. At the same time, contact your referee. Contact me as soon as you suspect there may be a problem. If you have not gotten a response by Tuesday, let me know right away. Thursday night is too late to help. Even with all of these precautions, there are going to be problems due to weather, unforeseen conflicts, and good ole Murphy. Try and be patient and have some understanding for other clubs problems. If you are reasonable, it will be a lot easier for the VRU to be reasonable with you when you have a problem. And if you insist on getting your butt up on your shoulder, remember, what goes around, comes around.

VRU Collegiate Men's All-stars:

Fields, Sideline Barriers, and Goalpost Pads:

We understand that all of you are at the mercy of your Universities. But sideline restraints and crowd control are your responsibility. Goalpost Pads are your responsibility. And if you cannot provide a safe field to play on, you will have to play all your matches away.

Old Boys:

Same thing as last year. If I had to make one suggestion to the CM clubs, it would be to develop your Old Boys network. Your former members can provide much needed funding, support and leverage with your University. You can benefit from their experience, and in those cases where they are active members of a Men's Club, they can provide coaching clinics, balls, equipment and invitations to events. In return, you can provide them with much needed new blood, that already knows the basics and is ready to take the pitch when they graduate. And I would encourage all of you to continue to play once you leave school. Clubs can help you find jobs, places to live, and friends with similar interests, a real boost as you step out of Never Never Land into the real world.

Lastly, I need to let you know that I am stepping down as VRU Collegiate Coordinator. Matt Robinette (ODU Coach) is running for this position, and I urge you to support Matt's election. He has been involved in rugby for over 20 years, and has a great deal of experience in both club and collegiate club rugby. I will be seeking to run for my third term as VRU President, and I ask your support for my election as well. I will still work closely with Matt as he gets settled in, and will also continue to be directly involved with the VRU Collegiate All Stars and the MARFU Men's Collegiate Division I.

It has been a pleasure and a privilege to work for you these past 10 years. I hope I have left the VRU CM program in better shape than I found it, and if I ever had to fuss at any of you, or your predecessors, well, you deserved it. (large grin)

USA Rugby has accepted VA's application to become a State-Based Organization (SBO) at the HS and youth level. This was at the conference on the game in San Diego where the next steps were hashed out.

In concrete terms, the long-term goal of the SBO is to produce a structure that will allow us to transfer all HS rugby in VA to the VHSL. USA Rugby through IRB grants will provide financing for a full time position of Executive Director and have a game development officer for the State in order to help with the process. There will be the creation of an organizational model that has been used by every other recognized sport in the US.

The goal is to help grow Rugby at the High School level by "letting coaches coach". More information will be out at the beginning of the year.

On that note everyone will need to recruit new coaches/referees for HS and youth throughout Virginia.

Short term: There will be a website for the association where there will also include youth information.

So do not hesitate to send me the information.

At the HS level, we are schedules to have the state final on 6/6.

At the Virginia Rugby Union level:

Youth and High School Rugby in the Virginia Rugby Union (VRU) continues to gain in interest. We still do not have a viable High School program however, we are moving closer with the advent of being recognized by the VSHL.

The geographic regions would consist of:

- Southwest (Roanoke) - Open
- Tidewater - Open
- Central - Open
- Fredericksburg and North. - Bill Lucas (has offered already)

Then to have a representative to the VRS and have someone represent the VRU at all VHSL Rugby meeting.

This committee would meet as soon as possible in Richmond to discuss strategy on development of Youth grade and High School Rugby within the VRU.

There were at least two inter-team youth matches this past season with strong showing for both the Hanover Youth and Richmond Lions programs. I recommend that all Virginia Rugby Union Summer Youth programs format to the same season with Northern Virginia Potomac Rugby Union Clubs for more diversity and competition. This would be from early May through to mid-July.

Referee Society of Virginia Chairman

The Referee Society of Virginia has had very slow growth the last several years. I blame much of this on USA Rugby making it too difficult to become a referee. Despite having had a rugby referee clinic each year that I have been president – five years – we average only about three ruggers per year becoming referees, and then not all of them full-timers. Meanwhile, several full-time referees have moved, retired, or slowed down to part-time. A couple months ago, USA Rugby made changes to its referee level 1 clinic. Now instead of a mandatory test to send in to USA Rugby...something that seemed to deter most clinic participants from becoming referees...there will be an in-class test with instant scoring and feedback. USA Rugby has also lowered the cost considerably. Also, we will now be having a one-day referee and touchjudge clinic instead of two days, another deterrence from the past. Hopefully this will increase the numbers of new referees. At the time of this writing (January 2), our referee level 1 clinic has 18 signed up for January 13, our largest class ever. As these will be new referees, please be patient with them as they start refereeing their games this spring.

You have probably heard the rumors of drastic law changes coming in this fall. You can probably count on it. For the spring, rugby as usual. For the fall, we may see a whole different game. If so, we will plan to have our Referee Society of Virginia AGM in July instead of August so that we can all be trained in them and be on the same page in time to go out and visit clubs in their fall pre-season practices. If any club wants a referee to visit and go over the laws of the game, please let me know and I will attempt to line up a referee to come to you. ref@rugby.org

We are always continuing to increase our referee abilities. As such, we have exchange agreements with Texas, Northern California, the South, and send at least three referees out on Mid-Atlantic exchanges each season. In return, you get the benefit of better referees and seeing other referees who come in from these other societies to get evaluated here.
